For everyone's safety and comfort

1. No personal fires

- There will be multiple braziers near the main hang area and a big bonfire. We cannot facilitate 40-odd fires or the ability to put them out in the event of a fire emergency.

2. Keep the communal spaces maintained

- Please keep the porta loos and community kitchen spaces clean, tidy, fresh, and pest-free for the next user.
- Cleaning products will be provided.

- Self-explanatory. :D

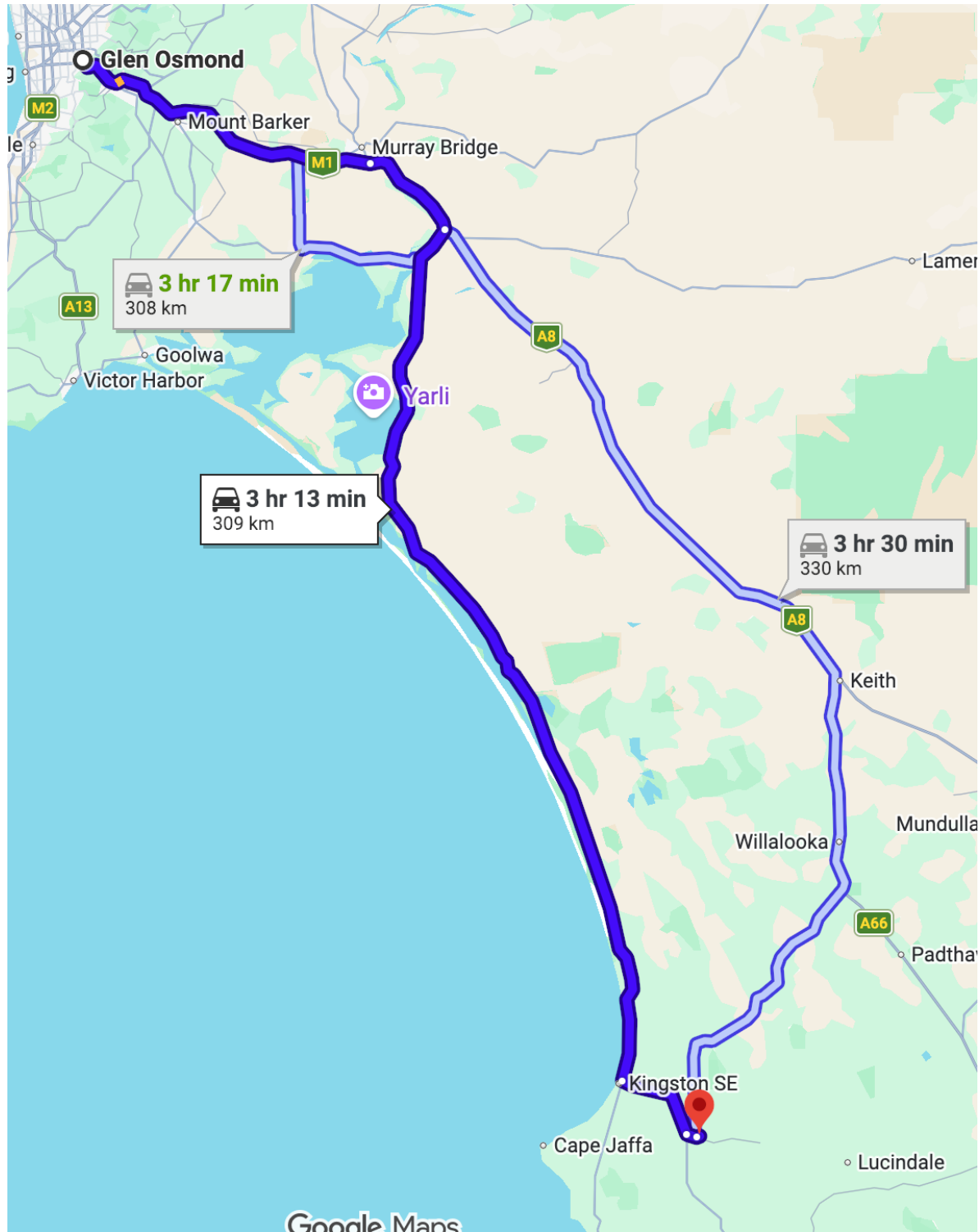
